It consists of a survey and physical examination (including HPV testing.)</b></p>	<p><b>NHIS 2010 Adult Survey Questionnaires</b>  <b>* Cross-sectional household survey sample that occurs each year. Consists of a core questionnaires and supplements. One adult and one child for each household are chosen as the sample adult and child.</b></p>	<p><b>NSFG</b>  <b>* In-person interviews of men and women 15-44 years of age in US household, conducted 48 weeks per year for 4 years.
